The **Operations and Supply Chain Management Area** in the **Haskayne School of Business** at the University of Calgary is accepting applications for a Postdoctoral Scholar in **Supply Chain Management**.

Job Description:

The researcher will work on the Canadian Northern Corridor Project in establishing optimal supply chain design and operations that will support economic growth and diversification through access to expanding international markets and under-served regions within Canada. The researcher will directly work under the supervision of Dr. Osman Alp and with potential collaborators from an interdisciplinary team of researchers.

The initial appointment is for one year starting on September 1, 2019, or on an agreeable earlier date, and is renewable for the second year on mutual consent, satisfactory performance, and funding availability.

Qualifications:

Applicants must hold a PhD in Operations Management, Supply Chain Management, Industrial Engineering, Operations Research, Management Science, Applied Mathematics/Statistics, or a related discipline. The candidate must have strong skills in optimization and a good knowledge of computer programming. Knowledge of a GIS software is also preferred.
