The Carroll School of Management at Boston College invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position at the Assistant Professor level in Operations Management. In exceptional cases, a higher-level appointment may be considered. Applicants must have a Ph.D. (or ABD) in Operations Management/Operations Research or related discipline and an outstanding research and teaching record or potential. The appointment is expected to begin September 1, 2020.

Applicants should upload a current vita, cover letter, sample research papers, a summary of teaching evaluations (if available), and three letters of reference to <http://apply.interfolio.com/67916>. Application deadline is October 23, 2019. Late applications will be accepted, but may not receive full consideration. Interview opportunities are available at the 2019 INFORMS Annual Meeting in Seattle. Candidates who are interested in INFORMS interviews are strongly encouraged to upload their CVs or complete as much of their applications as possible by October 2, 2019.
