- ◇ Please send a no longer than **100 words abstract** of continuous text (no bullet points, no math or Greek symbols) describing your research to POMS2023@rennes-sb.com using the [submission template](#). The title should be no longer than 10 words.
- ◇ One person can present two papers at most.
- ◇ **The deadline for abstract submission is 28 February 2023.**
