

Two Open-Rank Faculty Positions in Operations Management

The Nanyang Business School (NBS), Nanyang Technological University, Singapore, invites applications for faculty positions in Operations Management.

Two positions are available: one at the Assistant/Associate/Full Professor levels (tenure track), and the other at the Lecturer/Senior Lecturer level (teaching track).

Key Benefits:

NBS offers competitive salaries commensurate with the candidate's qualifications and experience. A reduced teaching load will be provided to research-active faculty. Generous funding support for research and conference travel is also available. (1) Requirements for the tenure-track position:

Applicants for the Assistant Professor position should have completed or be close to completing a PhD in Operations Management, Operations Research, Business Analytics, or a related field. Candidates for the Associate/Full Professor position are expected to have an established record of research excellence and academic leadership. The primary responsibility of the job holder is to conduct high-quality research and teach undergraduate and graduate-level courses in operations management and business analytics. While we welcome candidates from all areas of Operations Management, the preference is for candidates who use empirical research methodologies (broadly defined) to address the research questions. Candidates with an interdisciplinary research focus are especially encouraged to apply. Teaching experiences in business analytics, econometrics, and operations management will be considered a plus.

- Candidates for the Assistant Professor position should demonstrate strong publication potential in top-tier journals.
- Candidates for the Associate Professor position should have an established record of excellence in research and teaching.
- Candidates for the Full Professor position must demonstrate significant achievements in research and teaching and, in particular, the leadership impact of these scholastic achievements. They must have made substantial contributions to their profession and have international visibility.

Application for the tenure-track position:

(2) Requirements for the lecturer/senior lecturer position:

Applicants should have extensive industry and/or academic experience, a passion for teaching and preferably possess a master's or a PhD degree in operations management, operations research, supply chain management, or closely related discipline, with the relevant professional qualifications.

Candidates applying for this position should possess a strong track record of teaching excellence at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. They should demonstrate their ability to actively engage students, contribute to curriculum development, and efficiently manage course administration for operations courses. In addition, candidates must exhibit exceptional teaching skills and be willing to collaborate closely with students and course coordinators.

Furthermore, candidates should have the flexibility and expertise to teach a diverse range of courses at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. As Lecturers and Senior Lecturers, they will also be expected to actively participate in practice-based research and contribute to the development of technology-enabled learning approaches for the courses. Successful candidates will be appointed for an initial three-year term, which is renewable based on performance.

Given our expanding course offerings, we are particularly interested in individuals who are adaptable and willing to acquire new skills to effectively teach newly developed courses.
