# The PhD in business administration with a concentration in supply chain management

A full-time residential program for students whose career goals are full-time, tenure-track research and teaching positions at research-focused universities, the PhD with a concentration in supply chain management will develop your capability to recognize problems related to supply chain management, frame these problems into research questions, and address them in a scholarly way.

During the program, you will review, analyze, conduct, and publish research. A series of doctoral seminars and research methods courses, as well as participation in active research projects, will prepare you for your research. Additionally, you will develop and hone your teaching skills through assignments as a teaching assistant or instructor.
