# Gender gap and microaggressions at a workplace



One of the panelists during INFORMS 2019 annual conference, Dr. L. Babayan presented on the topic of Microaggressions against underrepresented groups at a work place. Her presentation demonstrated how subtle sexism and microaggressions continue to have significant negative impact on women and other minorities, resulting in anger and frustration, lack of productivity; and often

keeping them from potential promotions and professional advancement. Dr. Babayan explained how this topic is even more relevant in the era of #metoo movement, where sexual harassment is getting more and more coverage, the microaggressions taking place in professional settings need to be taken just as seriously, since they not only have the potential to perpetuate the gender bias, hence the gender gap but also are symptoms of potential sexual harassment or coercion. She presented different types of microaggressions that commonly take place in various professional settings, including academia; and emphasized how imperative the understanding and preventing of those instances are in order to guarantee a more economically and emotionally equitable workplace. A discussion and a Q/A at the end of the presentation shed light on how to better engage in the continued and productive fight for a faire workplace that doesn't exclude or undermine minorities.
