The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor, with an expected start date of July 1, 2020, or shortly thereafter.

Applicants must have earned a Ph.D. degree in Operations Management, Statistics, or a related discipline, by the date of appointment or shortly thereafter, with a demonstrated record of excellence in research and a demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching. In addition, applicants for the position must have a strong theoretical and methodological background in their area of specialization, as well as the demonstrated ability to apply this knowledge to important questions and issues in management.

We seek candidates whose research and teaching interests complement our [existing strengths](#) in the Operations Management and Statistics Area, and reinforce our expertise in data analytics. A commitment to excellence in teaching will be demonstrated through the statement of teaching philosophy, teaching accomplishments, and teaching dossier or other evidence of superior performance in teaching-related activities (such as performance as a teaching assistant or course instructor, experience leading successful workshops or seminars, student mentorship, or excellent conference posters or presentations), as well

as strong letters of recommendation, and strong performance during the on-campus presentation for short-listed candidates.
